UU Wellspring Group Spiritual Direction

These spiritual direction groups have been created for UU Wellspring participants who prefer small group spiritual direction rather than one-on-one direction. The spiritual directors listed will welcome four participants from various UU Wellspring programs per group. Working in a group is a wonderful experience and provides yet another opportunity to explore your spiritual life in a small group setting. Some people are in a group and in one-on-one direction so feel free to do both if your capacity allows!

Getting Started



Choosing a Group

Please read the biographies, check the times, and contact a spiritual director directly and promptly to reserve your place. Note that there are two religious professionals' groups for clergy and other religious professionals in UU Wellspring (one with Rev. Dr. Clyde Grubbs and one with Rev. Dr. Michelle Walsh). All other groups are open to all. Note that only one person from your UU Wellspring group will be in each group so please share your facilitators' names when you sign up so they can watch for that.

Fees and Expectations

Cost is \$25 for each person per monthly 75-minute meeting paid directly to the spiritual director. Sadly, if a group does not have four participants by Nov. 1, the group may be cancelled, or you may be offered a slightly higher rate (\$35). Note that you pay for all sessions, even if you miss one.

Process

The groups will function similarly, generally with an opening/brief check in, sharing by one person, gentle questions offered from the group and spiritual director, response from the person who shared (as they feel called), and closing. Usually, but not always, there is time for two people to share each time. It is amazing how much you will receive when companioning someone else in your group.

Timing

The groups begin in late October (if the group meets the last week of the month) or November and runs through May or June. Please contact the individual spiritual director before November 1, 2021 to register early to ensure each group fills. If a group is filled, please try a different group.

- providing brief, guided meditations
